

Hurricane Evacuation Plan

The Atlantic hurricane season runs from **June 1** to **November 30**. We need your help to ensure your pet is safe in the event a hurricane or other natural disaster affects the central Florida area. We've devised the following plan to help keep your animal safe during their stay with us. Please remember that Miss Emily's is **NOT** a hurricane or emergency shelter for animals.

1. Confirm Your Contact Information

Confirm your contact information on file with us is accurate so we can reach you while your animal is in our care.

Contacting you by cell phone or email is an easy way for us to reach you in an emergency.

3. Share Your Plans

Tell your emergency contact that you are leaving town and that your animal is staying at Miss Emily's during that time.

Let your emergency contact know that in the event of a hurricane or other natural disaster, we will contact him/her to pick up your animal.

2. Designate an Emergency Contact

Provide us with the personal information of an emergency contact that we can keep on file.

It's important that your designated emergency contact is from the local area and can pick up your animal during an emergency.

4. Monitor the Weather

We will monitor the weather for approaching hurricanes or other natural disasters. In the event a storm requires a mandatory evacuation, we will contact pet owners and emergency contacts to pick up animals.

To ensure a smooth evacuation, we may (at our discretion) begin evacuating prior to an official evacuation notice from local and state government.

Our proactive approach is designed to ensure the safe pick-up of all animals and allow you enough time to evacuate your homes, if needed.

Please remember that Miss Emily's Bed & Biscuit is **NOT** a hurricane or emergency shelter. Animals will not be allowed to remain at our facility in the event of a hurricane or other natural disaster that requires an evacuation.

Good planning and communication is essential to navigating hurricane season. We thank you in advance for your understanding and support. Your animal's safety is extremely important to us.
